Ministry Action Plan (MAP) Approved

We are pleased to announce that the Ministry Action Plan (MAP) that sets goals for our church from September 2022 to September 2023 was approved on Sunday, September 25, by the church-wide gathering. The plan generated a lively discussion before a single amendment was approved to the Introduction's *A Church United* section.

The approved amended MAP was approved by Church Council on Monday night, and is available for review on the church website. You can find it on

our website using the dropdown menu bars in the upper right hand corner of the opening page. Select ABOUT US and then click on the NEWSLETTERS tab.

Already our church is hard at work on accomplishing the plan's goals.

Some of the ongoing activities accomplished in September and October: weekly Sunday School classes have met; FISH, Triple L, and Anna's Friends have met; weekly church bulletins have been prepared; our Prayer List has been updated and prayer warriors have prayed for each service.

Some of the Fall accomplishments to date: financial updates have been added to our bulletins and newsletter; Gallery Hall has a new exhibit documenting our Honduras Mission; responses have been received to the Servant Ministry brochure; a survey on Music Ministry service opportunities; the Methodist Men have planned a pancake breakfast for October 29 and a Fall Bible Study; a Women's Bible Study is ongoing; our choir held a retreat to prepare for Advent; the Endowment team received training; a survey of software and hardware in use by the church is ongoing and staff have been trained on the existing software; and emergency AED's (automated external defibrillator) have been updated.

The Strategic Planning Committee is currently developing a system to accuratly track all of our accomplishments. In addition to regular reports to Church Council, the Strategic Planning Committee plans to report accomplishments using the newsletter, emailed News Blasts, and Ministry Moments. There's a lot happening at our church! Stay tuned to keep abreast of accomplishments and alert for opportunities to volunteer.

Jail Ministry Has Restarted

Upon the lessening of danger due to the Covid virus, God's outreach ministry to the women of the Franklin County Regional Jail has restarted. The staff at the jail has offered training due to the implementation of the federal regulation known as PREA, the prison rape elimination act. In August three of us underwent retraining and in September six more of us underwent retraininsg. This was required for us to be allowed to visit the inmates. We now have six volunteers who can visit who are experienced with our Jail Ministry Team and two new members who are trained but must have a background check completed with FCRJ before visiting. Currently we have two supporting members for a total of ten team members. We could use another member from FUMC.

We are excited about what these new volunteers have to offer the team. One is Sandy Wilson from Buck Run Baptist Church who plays the piano for Calvary Baptist Church. The other is Kim Caldwell who regularly ministers at the Federal Prison in Lexington where her husband works full-time as the Chaplain. Kim made a huge life change when she turned her life over to the Lord.

Four of our team members are from FUMC, two are from Forks of Elkhorn Baptist Church and four are from Buck Run Baptist Church. We believe that our different experiences and backgrounds help us strengthen each other for this ministry. This is because we learn from each other as we take turns visiting two by two, after the model of Jesus.

Our restart was made more complicated by the presence of fentanyl which you must have heard about in the news. The staff cannot simply scan personnel for the presence of this chemical. A very tiny but lethal amount cannot be detected by scanners. Because of that situation, the rules for what we can take into the jail are much stricter. We have adjusted to these rules and are trying to continue to allow the women a valuable experience in writing cards to their family and friends. Instead of giving them the craft supplies to decorate their cards, we must pre-decorate them. We are thankful for the talents of Phyllis Rogers and Mary Pat Hankla in decorating the cards. The inmates merely enhance them with crayons, which are still allowed, and write their letter with flexible felon pens. This saves time which can be used in additional discussion of the devotional message or other worshipful activity.

Recent visits have been encouraging because of the larger numbers of inmates attending and because of their participation in discussion and writing prayer requests. Please watch for their prayer requests in the church's prayer list that Ginny Smith provides.


