Ladies of all ages – Save the date – Tuesday, August 29

Our United Women in Faith are planning a picnic and shower for the GAP ministry, Tuesday, August 29. There will be more information about the picnic, but here is the information about the shower. People are having yard/garage sales and that is a good place to pick up some of these items, you can also check Goodwill and other like places for good, usable items. You might also have some of these items sitting in a closet waiting for someone who needs them.

Three or four boxes of kitchen items have already been collected and delivered to persons transitioning to housing from homelessness through our GAP program. What we want to do is get ahead of the program and have 2 or 3 boxes ready for whenever they are needed.

If you aren't able come to the picnic, but want to contribute, bring your items to the church office or to the Wesley Center sometime in August.

Here are some suggestions of what is needed, and we have divided the list by ages so that we don't all bring the same things:

• If you are 25 and under – and we would love to see some of our younger gals, teenagers and younger

Miscellaneous: plastic wrap, aluminum foil, waxed paper, quart and gallon plastic bags, small storage containers, shower curtain hooks

• <u>If you are 26-45</u>

Cleaning Supplies: spray cleaner, dish liquid, sponges, broom, dust cloth, paper towels, dish towels (dish cloths will be provided by First Needles) garbage can, garbage bags, toilet bowl brush

• If you are 46 - 60

Cooking Utensils: spatula, potato masher, paring knife, measuring spoons, measuring cup, manual can opener, soup ladle or large spoon, small cookie/biscuit pan, 1-1/2-2 quart pan, 8-10" skillet, pot holders, salt and pepper shakers

If you are 61 and over

Dishes: Plates, soup/cereal bowls, cups (mugs) – 4 each, glasses – 6

Silverware: knives, forks, spoons – 4 each, 2 serving spoons Other: baking dish, small/medium size mixing bowl

• For anyone - extras: Bible, basic cookbook, clock radio, small table lamp

Cinderella's Closet by Amy Snow

The 14th annual Cinderella's Closet program was held March 2023, at Memorial Baptist Church. 202 students, from 18 schools, attended. Counties included: Bath, Estill, Fayette, Franklin, Jessamine, Morgan, Menifee, Owen, Scott, Woodford, Wolfe.

The program used to be offered for one Saturday in March, (still serving 200+ students). However, since Covid, the program has been redesigned as a five day program. This allows schools to attend as a single group during a designated time slot. Over 70 volunteers assisted throughout the week in various facets including fairy godmothers, set up, clean up, check out,



and food hosts. An annual tradition, First United Methodist women met together to make framed poems that are included in the Cinderellas' gift bags. Several FUMC members volunteered and also provided food donations.

We are truly grateful for the financial support of our 2023 program! Program costs included the purchase of plus size dresses, shoes, jewelry, and other miscellaneous items.

Each year, we have many special stories of Cinderellas. This year was no exception. After the event, Franklin County Courthouse personnel reached out to inquire about a dress donation for a young lady who had faced extreme familial issues. An attorney knew about Cinderella's Closet and took the time to contact another individual who brought this student to her own private viewing of the dresses. We are thankful to have this program in our county!

The long-term outcomes of creating a special environment of love and grace, is something we may never be able to quantify but nonetheless, know that it touches the lives of students throughout Kentucky. It has always been my belief that in their future adult lives, our Cinderellas will remember "traveling to the church in downtown Frankfort" where their dresses were turned into dreams and that our heavenly Father would use that dream to bring them to him.
