The Mission of Thailand Now

Perhaps you were fortunate to be at FUMC when Mike and Sherri Morrissey visited our church this past summer and offered facts, stories, and real inspiration about their long-standing ministry in Thailand. However, if you will be learning about this ministry for the first time, Larry Epley's article, redistributed with his permission below, will offer valuable insight. Then during both worship services on Feb. 11, a Mission Moment will offer recent updates on the life-changing work of Thailand Now.

Thailand NOW

Serving the Thai people with the love of Jesus

What is Thailand NOW? It is the new name for the Thailand Methodist Mission which began in 2005 when a clergy couple from the Kentucky Conference felt called to the mission field. Mike and Sherri Morrissey met with the Board of Global Ministries and were assigned to Thailand since the United Methodist Church had no presence there. They began the process of learning the language, culture and making friends with Thai Christians. They began to plant churches, developing and training lay pastors using the Pioneer Pastors program. It is the vision of the Pioneer Pastor movement that every county have at least one thriving Thai church. With the prayers and support of Christian people, God has enabled Thailand NOW pastors and leaders to plant 47 new churches in previously unreached counties in Thailand (plus many more in counties that already had one church). The need is still great because 75% of counties (sub-districts) in Thailand are still unreached, having no Christian churches. The country is 95% Buddhist, 4% Islam and 1% Christian but the faith is exploding (see <u>https://msmorrissey.blogspot.com/</u>). The number of Christian churches increased from 2,250 in 2000 to 8,317 in 2022. Thailand NOW takes seriously the Great Commission in their new church plants. New church plants in turn have the passion to plant other new churches thus the Kingdom grows by multiplication.

Thailand NOW also takes the Great Commandment seriously. With the love of Jesus in their hearts they have a passion for "the least of these". With the leadership of the Morrisseys, it has established three Blessing Homes (Pattaya, Isan and TaParya) to rescue the most at-risk children from being trafficked in the sex trade in Thailand. The ones most at-risk are pre-teens and early teens without strong parental supervision. They also have Special Blessings Korat for special needs children. Thailand NOW has implemented the Abundant Life Savings Program (akin to the Dave Ramsey program) to teach financial budgeting and savings to families and small business owners. This proved invaluable during the pandemic when people could not work but Thai Christians who had savings could buy food and share with others. Phase two of the construction of the Abundant Life Training Center is scheduled to be completed in the summer of 2023.

Thailand NOW is an excellent example of Jesus' admonition in Acts 1:8 "... to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."
