# **Food Pantry**

Thank you so much for your financial support in 2023. This year the Emergency Community Food Pantry of Franklin County continued our 40+ years of service to the community in partnership with generous donors like you, tireless volunteers, and community partners. With the rising cost of food and neighbors in need, this year found us busier than ever.

Here are a few things we accomplished in 2023:

- Provided a week's worth of groceries, equaling about 152,460 meals to individuals and families in need.
- Provided 629 vouchers to allow families with young children to purchase fresh food.
- *Continued to operate with only volunteers.*
- Partnered with Franklin County Health Department, local schools and community organizations to provide over 700 emergency food bags to clients and students.
- Organized multiple food drives.

Here are a few things we hope to accomplish in 2024:

- Continue to provide vouchers to families with young children.
- Increase the number of monthly donors to provide a strong, steady source of income.
- Expand on the good progress made in 2023 re-establishing our in-person food drives.

# A Note From Jessica Neely

As the director of the Wesley Foundation, I am honored to be part of what God is doing. God continues to expand our reach, bring people to Christ and change lives. This fall, Student Life asked us to partner in Welcome Week activities. We served popcorn and snow cones for a movie night, organized a water day when it was 96 degrees outside, cooked hot dogs for freshman, and led a campus wide worship service to start the school year. That week we ministered to hundreds and one even accepted Christ.

During the fall semester we have a retreat and Jesus Week. The fall retreat theme was "Steppin' into the Light". Students were challenged to stop doing a "two step between light and darkness." One student said that God was telling her that she just needed to choose him. God began a work in many students' lives that produced fruit during Jesus week. Jesus Week is a week where the entire campus focuses on Jesus through activities hosted by the Wesley and other campus ministries. This year's theme was Faith Factor. Activities included Nerf Gun War, Gospel Karaoke, Friday Night Live, Revival, and Baptism/Dip Party. On Saturday night, 14 students accepted Christ. Dozens of others asked for prayer for things like healing from abuse, relief from anxiety and depression, and forgiveness. One student said "God is showing me that He is real." Another student said that he needed to stay connected to the vine so God could be with him in the dark places. Another student said that she kept letting dark negative thoughts drive her away from God. God was speaking words of love, healing, and repentance to many of the students present that night. The next night, 12 students were baptized! Students shared amazing stories of what God was doing and life transformation.

Throughout the semester, God has moved through our Sundaze worship, Bible studies, discipleship groups, and Jesus Week. As Marty testified, "So many doors He's opened, so many ways He's made, so many times He's healed me. He has been better than good to me!"
