Dear Frankfort First,

I officially retired from the Kentucky Annual Conference and now from you all, as of June 30. I have so many memories of my ministry and most of them include you! Paul and I will be back soon and I am so excited to have Rev. Dr. Leanne Hadley coming here! Here is the memoir I wrote for the Annual Conference:

Born into a parsonage family, the church has always been my home. I was nurtured by the people of Ashland First, Falmouth, Georgetown, Richmond and Lexington First. I heard my call through these churches and ultimately from my youth group when Phyllis Hail (retired diaconal minister) was invited by Jim Murphy (retired deacon) to share about her call in Christian Education and Diaconal ministry. Aldersgate Camp, retreats in Myrtle Beach and Lake Junaluska Lab Schools enhanced my spiritual journey. Kentucky Wesleyan College and Scarritt College prepared me for ministry.

My first appointment was in the Louisville Conference as Director of Christian Education and Youth at Memorial United Methodist Church in June of 1985 and consecrated as a diaconal minister in 1986. There I met and married my husband, Paul, who has supported my call to ministry in both in theory and practice from attending to driving the bus to cooking/cleaning to setting up and taking down events and more. After the birth of our daughter, Catelynn, and due to Paul's job, we moved to central Kentucky where I accepted an appointment as Minister of Christian Education at Frankfort First in June 1990, serving with my father. My sons, Quentin and Cameron, were born in Frankfort. I was ordained a deacon in 1997. Through the years I have served with nine senior pastors including Roy Webster, Bob Rice, Billy Ray Jennings, David Hilton, Jack Brewer, Wayne Sayre, Phil Hill, Jamie Williams and Tom Corum. For a few years, I also worked part-time for the Frankfort District, serving with Kenneth Cummings and Jean Hawxhurst. I have served with many staff and lay persons in both my congregations and across the district a conference through committees, leadership trainings and events. For professional growth and encouragement, I was active in Christian Educators Fellowship and continue in the Order of Deacons.

All of these people and experiences have enhanced my life and ministry as I have focused on planning, resourcing and equipping people and churches for discipleship in the church and the world. I am thankful for the opportunities and people God has placed in my life. I have a lot of emotions as this Annual Conference session includes my retirement as well as the memorial of my mother, two years after my father was honored. Now I am looking forward to the ability to rest, travel and spend quality time with my family, including children, son-in-law, daughter-in-law and new grandson, Leon. I also look forward to new opportunities to serve as the church will continue to be my home.

Dear Members of FUMC, Frankfort,

I am so excited that I have been appointed as your Associate Pastor and I cannot wait to spend time getting to know you and discovering ways we can be in ministry together!

I thought I'd tell you a bit about myself in case you are curious.

I grew up in KY, where my father served as a minister in the KY Annual Conference. My family moved to the West Ohio Conference when I was in first grade. I graduated DeVilbiss High School in Toledo, Ohio and attended Miami University, Oxford where I majored in Communications and Theater with a specialization in Creative Dramatics with Children. I spent my summers during college working with a Migrant Ministry Program providing childcare for the children of migrant farmers while they worked in the fields and teaching the adults English in the evenings.

After college, I attended United Theological Seminary, Dayton, Ohio, where I specialized in the spiritual lives of children and served as a youth minister and Children's hospital chaplain. After leaving



seminary, I served as a pastor in the West OH Conference and then moved to FUMC, Colorado Springs where I raised my two young boys, climbed mountains, served as Associate pastor FUMC, Colorado Springs, and founded First Steps Spirituality Center. I also began writing and consulting while there.

First Steps was a not-for-profit, ecumenical ministry, that provided spiritual care for hurting children and teens at no cost. We ministered to children of all ages who had experienced loss, death, the suicide of a parent or sibling, divorcing parents and anxiety, depression and really, anything that caused them stress or hurt.

After my boys grew up, I moved back to Kentucky where my niece, Janell, (who I had raised) and her family live. I have spent the past 8 years serving Christ Church UMC, Louisville, KY. I began there as a part time consultant for their Children's Ministry and then stayed! I most recently served as the Executive Pastor where I coordinated the staff and volunteers to discover where God was calling us and to implement existing and new ministries for all ages.

I just said good-bye to CCUM, and am now looking forward to serving you! I have been living in Frankfort for the past seven years. I moved to Frankfort to remain close to my family who live in Lexington yet be closer to Louisville. Frankfort was in the middle of the two places I needed to be and when I visited Frankfort, I fell in love with the downtown, the river and the historic places.

And now, I am able to live and work here, in your community ... in our community! I officially begin work with you on July 1, will be going with our Youth Ministry to Lake Junaluska the weekend of the July 6 and will be formally introduced and will be preaching at worship Sunday, July 14.

That is my story ... I cannot wait to hear yours! I look forwarding to meeting you!

Your Church Reaching Out



Gap Has Growing Pains

June is the perfect time to report to the congregation on the status of the God Answers Prayers (GAP) Through Compassionate People ministry! With nearly half the year behind us, GAP is pleased to announce that our homeless mission grows stronger every day.

Each month we pray with nearly 60 homeless individuals and offer assistance from our congregation in the form of Kroger cards, essential supplies and a simple brown paper bag filled with a day's worth of food. Our success can be seen in the faces of the struggling individuals who come recommended to our church for assistance. Their stories are diverse, but their circumstances are all similar.

Newly housed GAP friend, "PD," finished her first round of chemo treatment with her 16-year-old son at her side. Her prognosis is quite serious with chemo scheduled every two weeks for a year. A First UMC friend put together a chemo kit and she cried for joy at receiving the many useful items and the care she felt. They are quite proud of their apartment. Pray for her health during this serious and unpredictable cancer journey.

Newly housed GAP friend, "D," gave birth to her second child last week. There were several complications and the baby was moved to UK hospital with mom joining her the next day. With great improvement, both were dismissed from the hospital. She is glad to get back to her three-year-old and start this new chapter. With the help of First UMC, she furnished their apartment and received help with some other needs. After some maternity leave, she plans to get a job and finish her bachelor's degree as the children will be able to get into daycare. Pray for this single mom as she continues to work hard.

The needs are growing. In 2023, we began the year (January-April) averaging \$231 a month in Kroger card assistance and ended the year (November to December) giving an average of \$468. By January 2024, our Kroger card assistance averaged to \$436 a month. Since mid-April, our Kroger card assistance has increased to almost \$600 a month.

Our congregation has faithfully responded to the needs of this mission, and the GAP team continues to trust in God's plan. The needs are great and we are grateful for the strength of our church family's commitment. You can help by purchasing \$20 Kroger cards and dropping them in the collection plate along with your tithe.
