

First Church responded to the call, and we had an outstanding July and August. Thank you! We have reduced the amount we need to finish the year in the black by over half. However, we still have significant work to do. As you can see, we have still spent over \$55,000 more than we have received. Also, please be aware that by action of the Church Council, payment of apportionments and payments to budgeted Outreach line items other than GAP and our Honduras Medical and Dental Mission have been suspended since July. We hope to recover sufficiently in our giving to pay those commitments in full. The Finance Team and the church staff are working hard to reduce expenses. We pray for your continued faithfulness through your tithes and offerings.

# Kenucky State University Wesley Foundation by Jessica Neely

Ministry in these days is hard especially when you are on the front lines!. The beginning of the semester is outreach season, which is full of events that allow us to connect with students. We cooked hotdogs on freshman move-in day, served snow cones at the Freshman carnival, manned a table at the organizational fair, provided inflatables and snow cones for another campus event, and hosted worship in the amphitheater with other campus ministries. We also had a water day and all-you-can-eat wings. It has been busy. Why do we do it? Because our goal during this season is to connect with students and invite them to be part of the Wesley Foundation. We have over 100 names of interested students from these events, and over 50 were in worship last week for our Sundaze weekly ministry.

God has been working through these events. In the amphitheater, 40-50 students came forward to rededicate their lives to Christ and for prayer. I talked with a guy who is a senior this year at KSU. This summer, he decided he wanted to change his life and come back to Jesus. He wants a Christian community and is coming each week. There is a girl from Louisville who wanted to come to college, but had only raised \$100 towards the \$250 housing deposit. We were able to connect her with resources. There was a guy who came to college without toothpaste, toothbrush, towels, or food who went without food for 24 hours, and we were able to feed him a meal. Last week there was a girl from Nigeria and another girl from the Bahamas who were in tears after worship because they were so homesick and desperate for Christian community. One of our student leaders had a psychotic break at the end of July, but he is doing better and telling other students about how Jesus worked in the midst of his mental health crisis. Another student leader returned to school to find out that she couldn't enroll, so Jessica took the girl home with her. These are the front lines. This is where ministry is challenging for us, but not for God. There is so much need and so few laborers.

We need you to partner with God and us on the front lines. We want you to be used by God to change lives. First, become a prayer partner. Jessica texts out prayer requests once a week, and you pray. It's simple. If you want to be a prayer partner, text Jessica at 239-246-6454 and say, "I want to be a prayer partner," and she will add you to our list. Also, would you be willing to cook a meal for a Sunday night or breakfast on Friday morning? Or would you be willing to mentor a student? Could you support us financially? Finally, would you be able to help us on work days with cleaning or repairs? If you want to be on the front lines of ministry and God's work, reach out to Jessica at 239-246-6454.
