

Dear First Friends,

I hope the twelve days of Christmas which began on December 25 will be filled with grace and peace for all of you. And I pray that Epiphany, the season of Christ's fuller revelation to every corner of the world, will make us ready for a deeper

sense of how Christ will be calling First United Methodist Church to do God's holy work throughout all of 2025.

In his prologue, John the evangelist announces that "The true light, which enlightens **everyone**, was coming into the world." (John 1:9, emphasis added) Jesus the Christ is the true light which enlightens **everyone**. Christ is the light who was, and who is, and who is to come.

At First United Methodist Church, our theme for 2025 will be **EVERYONE**. You will find our 2025 Leadership Roll in this edition of our monthly newsletter. You will see that new leaders will be joining seasoned leaders in caring for the work of our ministry teams. But the ministry of the church is, and will be, not only the work of our leaders, but of **everyone**.

In the coming year, we will seek to live out God's vision for us rather than running frantically in every direction. This will call for **everyone** in our congregation to have a voice and a place in our unfolding ministry. When our vision is clear and **everyone** finds a place and a voice, when we stop and take time to listen to God and one another, we will live and grow and serve together with our cups full rather than empty. To that end, be on the lookout for something new—specific ways you will be invited to join church leaders as we bring together team work, listening, and prayer.

"The true light, which enlightens **everyone**, was coming into the world." This is the good news into which we will seek to live more deeply with growing joy as we look toward the brightness of a brand new year with new ways of doing ministry and new possibilities on the horizon. I am grateful that all of you are willing to work, listen, and pray for the sake of whatever particular portion of Jesus' ministry in this world will be assigned to us. I trust you will join me as we pray for one another and for the Holy Spirit to lead and fill us and **everyone**.

## Frosty 5K Success

The Frosty 5K race to benefit the Honduras Medical Mission went off on December 1 in *frosty* weather! The snowy start didn't deter hardy runners and our own Steven Meyer finished first overall despite racing with his arm in a cast! The race was only possible thanks to the support and generosity of tireless volunteers who set up/took down race equipment, announced race results, offered drinks and were ready to provide first aid, if necessary. The Frosty 5K is our biggest fundraiser for the Honduras Medical Mission and our two established medical clinics. Our church also provides direct support each year to keep those clinics locally staffed all year long.

At the race, Sabrina James organized a bake sale to fund new defibrillators and replacement pads/batteries for existing defibrillators that we've already taken to Honduras. She hopes to raise \$1200 to purchase a high-quality Zoll AED that has extra feedback (in Spanish). This best-quality AED greatly increases the odds that the AED user will save the life of someone in cardiac arrest. In addition, a specialized "training AED" would be available at a 50% cost break if we can afford the high-quality AED. Dr. Elmer, a dedicated dentist who funds his dental clinics by teaching CPR to medical staff, will receive the training new device.

Many thanks to those of you who baked goodies, bought cookies and helped explain to the crowd the importance of Automatic External Defibrillators. Donations are still needed.

## God is Answering Prayers, Thanks to YOU!

In 2024 the GAP (God Answers Prayers Through Compassionate People) Ministry was deeply blessed. Since our beginning two years ago, we've witnessed to 323 individuals, including children. This year alone, we saw 143 new homeless neighbors. Our budget has remained stable this year thanks to the benevolence of our congregation and the commitment of our church.

We are deeply grateful for those of you who have dropped Kroger cards in the offering plates, sent packages from the GAP Amazon Click-List, and knitted warm winter hats. We've been blessed with donations to our Welcome Home room that provides free household supplies to individuals who are newly housed or in a housing emergency.

We've developed closer ties and new liaisons with others in our community who serve the homeless. We've strengthened relationships with the Franklin County Sheriff's office, The Homeless and Housing Coalition of Kentucky, our local schools, community churches, Fresh Start, and others. We strive to be good stewards of the resources you've shared and work to ensure we don't duplicate services provided by others.

Thanks to Connie Jones, 2025 will see the start of a new initiative. We currently serve fifteen homeless children each month. As a former classroom teacher, Connie is honoring the lifetime legacy of her husband, David Jones, and his servant heart. She is launching The David Project in coordination with GAP to provide new items to our homeless children with a focus on reading. The David Project will be housed on the second floor of the Todd House in a room that welcomes children. We give thanks for Connie's vision and also for the generous gift from Paul and Betty McNees to ensure our homeless children have Christmas presents to open this year.

In exciting news, our GAP staff is thrilled to welcome Tonya and Paul Kenner in 2025. Tonya will be working directly with the homeless and Paul will be helping with our emerging laundry ministry, among other things! GAP looks forward to 2025 and the opportunities it will bring to serve our growing homeless community. We are blessed to have a caring church community who epitomizes Deuteronomy 2:7, "Surely the LORD your God has blessed you in all your undertakings".




### **Births**
