

And We're Off...

Dear First Friends,





- In 2024 we welcomed 16 new members to FUMC, including 7 from our Confirmation Class.
- Our in-person worship attendance is on the rise—from 160 in 2022, to 165 in 2023, to 170 in 2024. We celebrated 8 baptisms. The total number of persons involved in Christian formation groups grew from 181 in 2023 to 228 in 2024. We estimate that 200 people in our congregation were involved in mission/community ministries and that individually and collectively our congregation served 4,000 persons through community ministries for outreach, justice, and mercy.
- Financially, in 2024 our giving slightly exceeded our expenses, though our Church Council made a very difficult decision in July to suspend outreach payments to numerous ministries. We are committed to restoring our full support to those ministries in 2025. Together we also gave \$300,000 toward our mortgage principal, bringing our balance to under \$1 million.
- Lent will begin with Ash Wednesday on March 5 and will continue through Holy Week April 13-19. Our pastoral and music staff are already praying, talking, and putting shape to what we trust will be a meaningful and Spirit-led journey to Easter. Oh... and there will be a Mardi Gras Celebration on Tuesday March 4!
- Finally, through a new Collaborative Leadership Model, *everyone* is encouraged to participate in our monthly Church Council meetings, which will follow a new format of prayer and reflection, ministry area reports, and a time of focused working conversations that will flow organically from our ongoing work and allow us to continually listen for the Holy Spirit's leading. This will truly be a new way of listening, working, and leading *with everyone at the table*. Please plan to attend our first meeting of the year on Sunday, February 2, from 1:00-2:30 pm. We need you!



Church Finances

2024 presented many challenges to First Church financially. As the new finance chair, I am happy to report that our donations surpassed our expenses. Donations to the general budget totaled \$830,719 while expenses totaled \$827,495. We also had \$300,000 donated to the mortgage principal. However, we finished over \$77,000 under our 2024 budget. However, we did make sacrifices. In July the church suspended all mission payments to our local ministries, and we halted our mission covenant payments to the United Methodist Church. With your generosity, we hope not to need to do this in the future.

2025 holds many exciting possibilities for FUMC to partner with God in God's work of love and reconciliation in the world. Our 2025 budget is set at \$887,642 with \$106,500 toward missions/dynamic outreach; \$11,205 for spiritual nourishment including youth, children and senior adults; \$29,500 for worship and glorifying God which includes music, Sunday School, and Bible studies; \$372,798 for the trustees for the mortgage payment, maintenance on the buildings and utilities; and \$367,639 for support which includes staff salaries.

Homeless Suffer in Bitter Weather

Winter put the bite on our GAP (God Answers Prayers through compassionate people) Ministry. A combination of holidays and icy roads meant that our GAP program was closed for several days during December. Our January numbers reflect those we missed during December.

We had a generous donation in December that allowed us to provide Christmas presents to homeless families. Despite their desperate circumstances, several struggling families received the joy of Christmas blessings this year.

In December, the GAP Ministry received a generous donation from the First Christian Church Bible Buddies, as well as a grant from our friends in Tennessee who see the good work we are doing with our Frankfort homeless.

We are deeply grateful for the warm gloves, hats, scarves and socks that many of you have sent (or made by hand!) in response to our plea. These items leap off the shelves of our GAP "store." As temperatures dipped below freezing, our unhoused friends greatly appreciated being able to look through our assortment of winter gear to select items that fit their heads, hands and needs.

The needs are great and winter isn't over yet. Current needs:

- \$20 Kroger cards
- Warm weather accessories: winter hats, gloves, scarves, and socks.
- Supplies for our Brown Paper Bags that provide a single day's worth of food: individual pouches or pop top cans of SPAM, chicken, Beanie Weenies, Vienna Sausage; pudding cups; individually packed cookies and chips; and Hot Hands pocket warmers.
- Supplies for our GAP "Store:" lotion, chap-stick, small flashlights, small bottles of allergy and cold medicines, purse size cough drops and tissues, toilet paper and dog food (we repackage both of these for backpacks), nail files and clippers, hair brushes
