From the Pastor's Desk

Dear First Friends,

We are having a good Lent. That seems strange to say, but any opportunity to grow in our love of God and our love of others should be good, don't you think?

Our Mardi Gras bASH was so much fun, and a great success! Ash Wednesday saw just over one hundred people total attend worship at noon or 6:00 pm in the sanctuary, or come for drive-by ashes in the early evening. (There were even two dogs who received the marking of ashes!)



Many folks are finding our Lenten devotional book *Pauses for Lent* by Trevor Hudson meaningful and transformative. Whether you are reading the devotional or not, there is still time to join us for Lenten Reflections and Communion on Wednesdays at 11:00 am in the Sanctuary or to share in Lenten Reflections online on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm. Contact Leanne for the Zoom link if you would like to join that group.

You all have done a wonderful job of filling up our Easter Baskets of Love. I am so encouraged by the excitement among us as you bring your weekly items, as well as the joy on everyone's faces as the children collect the items every Sunday during worship. Indeed, Lent isn't just about *giving up* something, it's also about *giving* to help others.

As we near the end of the first quarter of 2025, I want to remind you that in January we cancelled one Sunday of worship and experienced very low attendance on another, both due to extreme weather. Because of that, giving to the operating fund in January was very low. We saw improvement in February, but we really need to make up for those lost Sundays so that we don't get further behind and become distracted by financial worries. In the church, we turn money into mission and ministry. Please help as you can, as much as you can.

I also want to encourage *everyone* to participate in our monthly Church Council meetings at 1:00 pm on the first Sunday of each month in the Susanna Room. We begin with a time of prayer and reflection, share ministry area reports and business, then engage in a time of focused working conversations around a certain aspect of our current and/or future ministry. *Everyone* is needed and valued at the table. If you want to listen to God, keep up on our ministry as it is happening, and help shape the future of FUMC, please come!

Finally, Holy Week will be here soon. Your FUMC staff has worked prayerfully and intentionally to plan meaningful activities and worship services between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. I urge you to make those activities and worship services a priority in your schedule. These are some of the most important and holy days of the Christian year. I promise you that Easter will be much more meaningful and joyful if you take the time to engage in the church's offerings during Holy Week. Keep your eyes on FUMC communications for the specifics.

May God bless your journey of faith each day. May we be faithful together in following God wherever and however the Holy Spirit is leading First United Methodist Church.

As the weather moderated, more individuals have been able to make the trip to our church for spiritual comfort, a lunch bag full of food, a few essential supplies like flashlights and toilet paper, and the desperately needed Kroger cards.

In the bitter winter weather, our unhoused neighbors were deeply grateful for the supply of warm socks, cozy hats and winter gloves that seemed to arrive regularly just as our supplies were growing low. Thank you to everyone who sent in supplies to ease their misery.

Despite the cold and snow, our GAP friends have a cheerful attitude. They live each day, one day at a time, and we are blessed by their friendship as deeply as they are blessed by our generous church.

We are getting ready to launch some new initiatives, including a laundry ministry thanks to Tonya and Paul Kenner, as well as a literacy initiative dubbed the David Project after Connie Jones' husband. She was moved to honor his servant's heart and is working to set up a room with free books and educational "toys" for children affected by homelessness.

We have been blessed by the faithfulness of the Upper Room Sunday School class. They pack lunch bags each month to offer to our GAP neighbors.

FUMC Grounds Workday Saturday, April 12

A general Spring work day to clean up church grounds before Easter will be held on Saturday, April 12, from 10 am until 12 noon. We are hoping for enough volunteers we can accomplish several simple tasks in a 2-hour span. (Bring your own rakes, brooms, work gloves, clippers or we will have extra.)

These tasks include:

- Trim shrubs in front of Youth building and rake the bed
- New mulch spread over existing beds and around shrubs
- General weeding and cleaning up of flower beds
- Weed pulling around Todd House and from under trees in front of Todd House
- Trimming dead spots from boxwoods
- Clean up under outdoor stairway of Todd House and outdoor basement stairs behind Averill House
- Clean/ carry to trash pieces of deteriorating concrete in small bed behind Averill House
- Sweeping and raking around all buildings and edges of brick wall to tidy up.


